

God sent me before you to preserve for you a remnant on earth, and to keep alive for you many survivors. SECOND READING: 1 Corinthians 15:35-38, 42-50

Lector A Reading from the First Letter of Paul to the Corinthians.

Someone will ask, "How are the dead raised? With what kind of body do they come?" Fool! What you sow does not come to life unless it dies. And as for what you sow, you do not sow the body that is to be, but a bare seed, perhaps of wheat or of some other grain. But God gives it a body as he has chosen, and to each kind of seed its own body. So it is with the resurrection of the dead. What is sown is perishable, what is raised is imperishable. It is sown in dishonor, it is raised in glory. It is sown in weakness, it is raised in power. It is sown a physical body, it is raised a spiritual body. If there is a physical body, there is also a spiritual body. Thus it is written, "The first man, Adam, became a living being"; the last Adam became a life-giving spirit. But it is not the spiritual that is first, but the physical, and then the spiritual. The first man was from the earth, a man of dust; the second man is from heaven. As was the man of dust, so are those who are of the dust; and as is the man of heaven, so are those who are of heaven. Just as we have borne the image of the man of dust, we will also bear

the image of the man of heaven. What I am saying, brothers and sisters, is this: flesh and blood cannot inherit the kingdom of God, nor does the perishable inherit the imperishable.

THE NICENE CREED

Lent Madness - vote for your favorite Saints for the coveted Golden Halo!



The Disciple's Way Lenten resource from Forward Movement

Pick up a copy of *The Disciple's Way: Daily Reflections for Lent* in the Narthex from Forward Movement, which celebrates its 90th anniversary this year. This book revisits call to discipleship found in the original Lenten resource of 1935 and expands it with new contemporary daily reflections. Text in gray boxes with a weekly theme and Scripture passages, are from the original. (Contemporary translations of the same passages are in the back of the book.) This resource calls us more fully into the seven steps of discipleship: turn, follow, learn, pray, serve, worship, and share. Forward Movement was founded on this premise, "If we want the Episcopal Church to be strong, we need our congregations to be strong. And if we want our congregations to be strong, we need them to be filled not with habitual Christians, but with disciples of Jesus Christ."


